



Rankings and league tables

In 2010 Cardiff University was ranked 122 out of approximately 10,000 universities worldwide, putting Cardiff in the top 1.5% globally (QS). This shows that Cardiff University is an established and recognised university with a global profile. The ranking table below is based on the Research Assessment Exercise (RAE), which is the only independent Government assessment of universities in the UK.

While rankings are a guideline, you should also pay close attention to the course you wish to study and what the university and individual school can offer you.

standard of a Cardiff degree. The University is recognised by more than 40 professional bodies which ensure that the University maintains the highest possible standards in teaching. In 2008 the University's teaching was also given the highest endorsement by the UK Government in a quality review.

Teaching methods

You will be taught in formal lectures, in small groups (called 'seminars') and one-to-one with tutors. Depending on your subject you may use laboratories, meet members of the public, operate specialist equipment and go on field trips.

You will also have access to Cardiff's online virtual system "Blackboard" to enhance and support your learning. It allows you to download handbooks, find your timetable and submit assignments from any internet connection.

Because Cardiff is a top-ranked research institution you can be assured that facilities at Cardiff are some of the best available. The University has 18 libraries, 28 computer rooms, fully-equipped laboratories and specialist resources for every subject.

Assessment methods

Assessment methods are different for each course. Most courses include some form of written examination and essays but you may also be assessed on presentations, class tests, laboratory results and group work.

Free assistance in English and maths

If you want some additional help with English language, or you find mathematics difficult, you can get free support from the University. The 'In-sessional' English courses can help you with presentations, reading strategies, pronunciation and academic writing. Even if you are confident in your language abilities you will probably improve your assignments and increase your job prospects.

How will studying at Cardiff be different?

Studying at Cardiff University may be different from the style of teaching in your country. You will be expected to use the libraries and internet to research topics. You will be asked to contribute your opinion, collate information and present evidence. Your own ideas will be encouraged.

Cardiff University is an innovator in 'problembased' learning. This means your lecturers will set you a 'problem' and you will have to work out the answer. This is a much more effective method of learning than just from a book.

Why is research important?

Universities that are considered to be the best in the world are 'research-led'. Being a taught or research student in a research-led institution like Cardiff *University has several advantages:*

recognition

Your degree will be recognised worldwide. The most famous and respected universities are research-led. Cardiff is part of the elite Russell Group of top research-based universities in the UK.

innovative courses

The curriculum of your course will include the latest information and be relevant to your career (see right).

teaching by globally respected staff

You will work with, and be taught by, staff that are pioneers in their subjects and contribute to the advancement of knowledge. It is important to Cardiff University's culture that all our academic staff teach students. In a recent survey more than 95% of Cardiff's international students were satisfied with the expertise of their lecturers.

enhanced careers prospects

Your career prospects will be enhanced. Employers usually favour research-led universities because they know graduates will be very well informed. Employment rates for Cardiff University's international graduates are 10% higher than the UK average.

excellent teaching facilities

You will find excellent teaching facilities because research-led institutions attract more funding. Cardiff University generates more than a £100 million annually from research grants and contracts.



You can get work experience through a part-time job (see page 40) or by opting for a Cardiff University degree that includes a year in industry. The Schools section (from page 16) lists courses which have year in industry options. The University's Careers Service also runs highly competitive 'taster' placements with employers.

Where is Cardiff?

Cardiff is located on the coast of South Wales, which has beautiful national parks and beaches only 30 minutes away. Cardiff is approximately 230km (145 miles) west of London and is easily accessed by train in about 2 hours. Cardiff has excellent transport links (ranked 1st in the UK for the most transport friendly city) with an international airport that has flights to many cities in Europe.

Weather in Cardiff


The average temperature in Cardiff in Winter is 7C and in Summer temperatures can reach up to 30C. With four seasons, UK weather is generally unpredictable and can vary considerably, however, Cardiff experiences less rainfall than other areas of Wales and is consistent with the rest of the UK.

The University knows that where you live is very important to you. You will want to settle quickly and live in a secure, well-located, sociable and conducive study environment. This is why Cardiff University provides a guarantee of accommodation in one of our highly-ranked University residences.

University residences

The University has 14 residences, each with different facilities, in different locations and at different costs. Your choices include:

- single or mixed gender accommodation.
- private or shared bathrooms. About 70% of University residences have private bathrooms (called 'ensuite').
- self-catered, part-catered or fully catered (with vegetarian options).
- a variety of social and sporting facilities.
 You will have your own study bedroom.
 Cardiff University does not have shared rooms or dormitories.

Close to campus

Cardiff's residences are very well located, with most residences being less than 2km to either the Cathays Park campus or Heath Park campus. The majority of students are able to easily walk or cycle to their lectures everyday. The table below gives the approximate walking times from three residences to four popular locations in Cardiff

Look at the map on page 41 to see where residences are located. You will also find that like the University, residences are within easy reach of shops, the city centre and parks.


Safe and supportive

One of the advantages of University residences is the support you are offered. Each residence has a network of residences staff, student wardens and security staff that provide 24 hour assistance. Only students, guests of students and staff are allowed on University residences sites. This makes them safe and secure.

How much does it cost?

The cost of residences depends on several factors which include the residence you choose, length of stay, meal options and whether you want private bathroom facilities. University residences are very good value as the cost includes water, electricity, security, furniture and internet access (where supplied). As everything is included in one price, it helps you more easily budget. To help with budgeting there is more detail about living expenses on page 40.

For the 2010/11 year self-catering residences ranged from £68 – £95 a week. Part/fully catered residences ranged from £82 – £99 a week. Rooms with private bathrooms are generally more expensive than rooms with shared bathrooms.

What do University residences provide?

The diagram above shows a layout of a typical apartment in University residences. In this example there are 6 study bedrooms, each with their own bathroom. The 6 occupants share a kitchen.

Every student has their own bedroom. Each room has a bed, desk, chair, wardrobe and storage. You won't need to buy additional furniture. Also Halls of Residence bedrooms are connected to the University network and highspeed internet. In your flat you will have access to a shared kitchen/dining room. This area includes a cooker, refrigerator, sink, table and chairs. If you choose 'ensuite' you will have your own bathroom with shower.

How do I reserve residences?

After you apply, and if you accept an offer to study, you will be sent full information on how to apply for University residences.

Coming to Cardiff with your family

The University has a limited number of flats, houses and studios available for first-year international students with family members. These residences are very much in demand and you may have to seek private accommodation. If you do choose private accommodation ensure you start looking as soon as possible and ask for assistance from the University.

The Students' Union

- The University's social life revolves around an organisation called "The Students' Union".
- Every student enrolled at Cardiff University is automatically a member of Cardiff Students' Union.
- The Union is run by a committee of students and is dedicated to the social and welfare needs of all students on campus. All profits made go back into improving the services available to you.
- The Union building includes a bar, nightclub, concert venue, shopping mall, cafés and an advice centre.
- The Union runs its own student newspaper, magazine, radio station and television station.

International café

The Students' Union also has a dedicated space where international students can make friends, eat, relax, play computer games, and meet as societies.

International societies

The best way to make friends is to join a "student society". These clubs are very important to student life and are run by other students. There are more than 120 societies, many of which represent areas of the world including: Arabia, China, Malaysia, India, Pakistan, Nigeria and many more.

For two weeks every year the international societies celebrate "Go Global" - a festival that showcases the University's diversity involving dance, music and food.

Sport & keeping fit

The University takes sport very seriously, and the Athletic Union runs 60 sports clubs and arranges fixtures against other universities. Almost every popular sport is played at the University and whatever your level you will find an opportunity to play and participate.

social events and parties, including traditional Welsh dancing. These are a great way to make friends.



Under the leadership of its current director, MRC Professor Ole Petersen CBE FRS, the School provides a dynamic and stimulating research and learning environment with impressive modern facilities and high-calibre staff. January 2011 saw the launch of three new University Research Institutes: Neuroscience and Mental Health, Sustainable Places and the European Cancer Stem Cell Institute. The Institutes, all of which involve School of Biosciences academics, were created to pursue new approaches to pressing concerns about cancer, mental health and sustainability. In the authoritative 2010 Annual World University Ranking (based on research strength and performance) compiled by Shanghai Jiao Tong University (http:// www.arwu.org), Life Sciences at Cardiff University is in the top 100 worldwide and in the top 10 in the UK. At undergraduate level, the School gives flexibility, allowing you to switch courses after the first year and also offering a four year programme. The extra year is undertaken on a placement, enhancing the knowledge you gain in the School's laboratories with practical work experience and insight.

The Bridge Programme is a full-time English language and study skills course in academic

It is specifically designed for European and international students. It is a good choice if

- plan to continue your higher education studies at foundation, undergraduate or postgraduate level.
- are looking for an intensive course with an academic focus to improve your general English.
- need to develop your professional English for business and industry.
- want to improve your IELTS score for university entrance or professional development.

The programme provides you with the skills and language needed for a smooth transition into academic study and professional life. The aim is to develop confident and successful students and professionals for the international marketplace.

The Bridge programme has three entry points in September, January and April. Included in the course:

- 20 tuition hours per week (plus self study and assignments).
- a free IELTS exam at the end of the 9-month course.
- one-to-one tutorial guidance and support. - free internet access on all University computers.
- use of all University academic and social facilities, including resource centres, computer workstations, sport and fitness centres, and the Students' Union.

Pre-sessional English language courses www.cardiff.ac.uk/elt/presessional

The Pre-sessional programme provides an excellent opportunity for students holding offers from or applying to study at Cardiff University, at postgraduate or undergraduate level, to take short courses in English for Academic Purposes.

These courses are highly intensive and are designed specifically for students who need only a short period of study to reach the required English language entry standard for their academic course.

You can take a course for 11 or 8 weeks depending on your level of English and academic requirements.

Please note that successful completion of a Pre-sessional summer course may not replace your condition of entry. Most offers will require you to take a recognised English language examination, such as IELTS, at the end of the course to prove you have reached the level stipulated in your offer letter.

How to apply

Applying for a place at University can seem complex – but at Cardiff the International Office is here to guide you every step of the way.

Entry Requirements

The University recognises qualifications from all over the world. To know if you would be considered for entry you can:

- look on the website. We have a dedicated section for many countries. This will give you an overview of qualifications we consider: www.cardiff.ac.uk/international/country
- contact the International Office.
- contact an educational adviser. The University has an international network of educational advisers (agents) who give free advice (see the website above for their contact details).

Some courses may require additional information or exams. For example: undergraduate architecture students must submit a portfolio. Check with the School. the International Office, online via the University's course finder or with an adviser.

English Language Requirements

In addition to academic aualifications, the University also requires an English language qualification. The University accepts IELTS, TOEFL and IGCSE/GCSE however the University also considers other English language qualifications, including the Indian Year 12 and WAEC.

Different courses will require you to get different scores, however most courses require an average of 6.5 in IELTS or equivalent. You will also be required to achieve a certain grade in sub-scores. Some courses require a higher overall score, especially those that are language-based and require more complex English usage. You should check the website, contact the School or ask the International Office if you are unsure of the requirement.

If you do not have the required English language level you may want to study an English course at Cardiff University. More information is on page 37.

How to work out your English level

If you do not have an English language qualification it is recommended you take an IELTS or TOEFL exam. The British Council (www.britishcouncil.org) can provide information on test centres in your country. When you have worked out your level you will know which course is right for you. You may also find this table of equivalencies useful:

Application procedure – Undergraduate / Bachelors

To apply for an undergraduate/bachelors degree course you need to use an organisation called UCAS and apply online at www.ucas.com

UCAS allows you to apply to up to five (four for medicine/dentistry) courses at any combination of UK universities using the same application form. The institution code for Cardiff is C15. Course codes are listed on the University's website.

If you want to apply for an undergraduate degree but only have 12 years of education, you may need to take a foundation programme/year zero. More information on applying to Cardiff University's International Foundation Programme is available on page 36.

Application procedure -Postgraduate Taught / Masters

You apply directly to the University for a postgraduate taught course. You can apply online at www.cardiff.ac.uk/apply or you can download paper application materials from the website. It is recommended that you apply online because it is guicker and you can track your application.

Application procedure – Postgraduate Research / PhD / MPhil

The application procedure for postgraduate research is the same as postgraduate taught (above), however you will also need to include a research proprosal. You should also make contact with a member of academic staff who could act as a potential supervisor to your studies. To do this:

- 1) look at the websites of University schools to see if there is a member of academic staff who matches your area of research. Website addresses for Schools are located in the Schools section of this prospectus.
- 2) send the member of staff a short e-mail outlining your area of interest.
- 3) mention on your application form which member(s) of staff you have contacted regarding your supervision.

If you are unsure whether the School is able to offer supervision for your research you can contact them directly. Email addresses for PhD enquiries are included in the Schools section of this prospectus where you will also find Cardiff University's areas of research.

Common **Ouestions**

Is there an application fee?

For the vast majority of courses Cardiff University does not charge an application fee. If you are applying to an undergraduate course, UCAS will charge a small fee, currently £21.

When is the deadline for applications?

The official deadline for undergraduate courses is the 30th June each year. If you want to apply after this date you should contact the International Office. If you are applying for a medicine or dentistry course the application deadline will be October 15th prior to entry in September the following year. Most postgraduate courses do not have a deadline. The University however encourages you to apply as early as possible to avoid disappointment. You will need to ensure you have enough time to complete the application process and, where applicable, get a visa. Some courses can also become full quite quickly. It is recommended you apply 9–12 months in advance of the course starting.

What if I don't have all my qualifications/ transcripts?

You do not need all your qualifications before you apply. You can take exams and submit your results after your initial application.

My studies have been completed in English do I still need an English qualification?

If you have previously studied in the medium of English this may be sufficient for the English requirement. This is at the discretion of the School. If you believe this could apply to you please state your reason in your application. You may still be required to provide a recognised qualification.

How long will it take to have a decision made on my application?

The University endeavours to make a decision on applications within six weeks, however during busy times it may take longer. If you have not had a response after six weeks please contact the International Office. Because PhD applications are more complicated, they can take longer to assess.

How to write your personal statement

All Cardiff University applications require you to write a personal statement. A good personal statement will help you get the edge over other applicants and is your opportunity to tell the University about yourself, say why you're interested in the course and provide details of any relevant experience you have. Below are some tips for writing a good personal statement:

- be enthusiastic. Admission tutors want students that are passionate about the area they are studying. You should write why you are interested in the course, what research you have done into the subject area, and what you plan to do after you graduate.
- include any work experience. If you have any relevant work or voluntary experience this will help show your commitment. For example: if you are applying for a journalism course, include any experience you have working on student newspapers. This is very important for students considering applying to healthcare related courses. The admission tutors will want to be convinced that you understand the demands of working in these professions.
- show you can be part of a team. Admission tutors are looking for students that will integrate and work well with other students. If you have been a member of a team, or held a position of responsibility, you should show how these experiences will help you in your studies.
- include your interests. The University is also looking for students that will contribute to the wider student community. You should provide information on your social and cultural hobbies, for example: community volunteering or playing a musical instrument.
- demonstrate ability in English. It is a good idea to ask someone to proof-read your personal statement, and remember to run a spell-check. Even if English is your first language, you should detail how you have used English since your last English exam. For example: at work, or during your studies.

Tuition Fees

Tuition fees are different for each course. You should check the website or contact the International Office for further advice.

To make it easier to manage your finances you can pay your tuition fees in 3 instalments each year.

Living Expenses

For the 2011/12 session the University estimated that a single student in Cardiff would need £720 a month. These estimates are based on the actual experiences of students living in Cardiff.

This means for the year that:

- / an undergraduate student (September – June) needed £6,480 a year.
- / a postgraduate student (September June) needed £8,760 a year.

These estimates include accommodation, bills, food, books, clothes, travel, telephone and social expenses.

If you are intending to bring family members, such as a spouse or child, you will need to have at least an extra £400 a month for each family member.

Working Part-Time

Cardiff University is in the middle of one of Europe's fastest growing cities and there are many opportunities for part-time employment both on campus, and in the city. The University's "Jobshop" offers a free service to help you find part-time employment. Usual jobs for students include helping out in shops and at events, call-centre work and basic office assistance.

Most international students can work up to 20 hours during term-time and full time during the holidays. The University does not recommend you work the full 20 hours during the term because studying in the UK is intensive and you will need to make sure you have enough time to complete all your coursework and reading.

How does Cardiff compare with other places?

Cardiff has many advantages which make it a cheaper place to study than other university cities. These include:


- / Cardiff is a compact city and the University is in the middle therefore you won't have far to travel between the University, city centre shops and your accommodation.
- / Cardiff is also very flat making it easy to walk or cycle around. You won't need to spend money on buses or taxis.
- / Cardiff council runs bicycle and car sharing schemes. This will make it even easier for you to get around without large extra costs.


Cardiff is also one of the most affordable of the traditional University cities. The table below compares the Russell Group of Universities, and the average cost of rent for students per week. Cardiff is almost £8 cheaper a week than the average UK student rent, and a massive £45 cheaper a week than rent in London. This does not include other items such as food and entertainment which are also significantly more expensive in other cities, especially London.
